The Noble family is hosting a blood drive in Jack's memory on the anniversary of his 8th birthday to raise awareness for the many children in the Chicagoland area who are battling diseases that require them to have blood transfusions. Jack Noble was an energetic, happy 2-year-old when he was diagnosed with a rare form of cancer called Rhabdomyosarcoma. He bravely fought the cancer for 14 months, and during that time he received chemotherapy and radiation treatments that impacted his red blood cell and platelet counts. As a result, Jack needed regular transfusions of whole blood and platelets so that he could remain strong enough to continue with his treatments. The Noble family worked with LifeSource's Directed Donor program to ensure that Jack would have a supply of whole blood and platelets at Children's Memorial Hospital when needed. Sadly, Jack lost his battle with cancer and died on July 12, 2006.

PLEASE BRING ID WITH YOU ON THE DAY OF THE BLOOD DRIVE.

ID is required to be permitted to donate blood. One of three following methods is acceptable: 1. LifeSource Donor Card; 2. Drivers License/Learners permit/state ID; 3. Donors presenting with only a picture ID may be accepted if: A through C below has been fulfilled. A. The donor's picture is on the piece of ID; B. The ID is printed with either donor's first and last name or first initial and full last name; C. The donor can verbalize his/her date of birth and either the last four digits of his/her social security number or another government issued ID number.

The above identification options are listed according to preference; Option "1" being first preference, Option "2" is second preference. Option "3" is the last preference.
